Read Alikes Dan Brown is a writer of suspenseful, atmospheric thrillers, overflowing with tantalizing tidbits of science, history, art, and religion. The following books have similar appeal factors .

Angelology by Danielle Trussoni A nun is drawn into an ancient struggle against the Nephilim, hybrid offspring of humans and heavenly beings.

The Book of Fate by Brad Meltzer A two-hundred-year-old code devised by Thomas Jefferson becomes the key to a present-day conspiracy at the highest levels of Washington and the power elite of Palm Beach

The Confessor by Daniel Silva In the wake of a Munich writer's assassination, Mossad agent Gabriel Allon and Vatican priest Pietro embark on dangerous journeys that reveal long-buried secrets affecting the fates of millions of people.

The Expected One by Kathleen McGowan Journalist Maureen Pascal discovers that she is destined to play a key role in an international quest to gain control of a priceless series of scrolls, written in *the* first century by Mary Magdalene and hidden in *the* wilds of *the* French Pyrenees.

The Fire by Katherine Neville Summoned to her family's Colorado hideaway for her mother's birthday, Alexandra Solarin not only discovers that her mother is missing but that the most powerful piece of the mystical chess service that had once belonged to Charlemagne has resurfaced.

Gemini Contenders by Clive Cussler Andrew *and* Adrian Fontine, antagonistic twin sons of Vittorio Fontine-Cristi, search separately for the small Greek monastery vault *and* its priceless ancient documents, hidden high in the Italian Alps.

Mephisto Club by Tess Gerritsen Boston Medical Examiner Maura Isles is summoned to the scene of a brutal killing and teams up with Detective Jane Rizzoli to investigate the victim's ties to Joyce O'Donnell, a cantankerous psychologist, and to a sinister cabal called the Mephisto Club.

The Name of the Rose by Umberto Eco In the early 14th century, the English monk William, visiting at a Clunic abbey in Italy, solves a murder.

Prey by Michael Crichton Deep in the remote Nevada desert, eight people are trapped inside of the Xymos Corporation by a rapidly evolving swarm of predatory molecules that have massed together to form a powerful and intelligent organism that is targeting its creators.

The Templar Legacy by Steve Berry Former secret agent Cotton Malone and Stephanie Nelle, a U.S. Justice Department prosecutor, must solve the mystery of fourteenth-century Templar riches and secrets before Raymond de Roquefort and his murderous allies prevail.
